These ideas are changing the way I am in the world, and making me hopeful again.



Driving Educational Equity: The Equity Scholar in Residence Program

Our partners report that our work has led to:

- Increased educator inclusive classroom practices;
- New district-wide policies and practices;
- Disciplinary practices leading to restoration and repair;
- Increasing community support for equity initiatives;
- Increasing equity practice in coaching and refereeing;
- Increased voluntary participation in professional development related to equity;
- New classroom practices to prepare students to be active participants in a multicultural democracy;
- Increasing supportive behavior toward marginalized students and colleagues;
- Introduction of inclusive practices in subjects like science, math, and health.



With the support of our Equity Scholar in Residence, we are now able to have nuanced, complex and often challenging discussions in our classrooms so that we can move to a place of more genuine belonging and inclusion.

Accelerating and Sustaining Organizational Change Reframing Equity Services



I usually leave events about equity discouraged and angry, with little understanding about how to make real, systemic change in our organization, and little to offer my staff besides more training that leaves them discouraged, too. Reframing Equity focuses on:

- Practical, everyday personal behavior;
- Designing and tending to systems to ensure and protect equity;
- Learning opportunities tailored to unique organizational questions and challenges.

This approach drives change on relational and systemic levels, and builds the capacity to sustain it.

In 2024 we will secure our ongoing capacity to generate and implement new strategies for change.


